

The Sacrament of Holy Communion

One: The Lord be with you, **All: And also with you.** One: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them up to the Lord.

One: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise!

One: It is right, and a good and joyful thing, always and everywhere, to give thanks to you, Almighty God, creator of heaven and earth.

In the beginning, your Spirit moved over the face of the waters.

You formed us in your image and breathed into us the breath of life.

When we turned away, and our love failed, your love remained steadfast.

Your Spirit came upon prophets and teachers, anointing them to speak your word.

And so with your people on earth and all the company of heaven, we praise your name and join their unending hymn.

All: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord, God of power and might, Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is the One who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!

One: Holy are you, and blessed is your son, Jesus Christ, At his baptism in the Jordan, your Spirit descended upon him and declared him your beloved Son.

Your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor,
To proclaim release to the captive and recovering of sight to the blind;
To set at liberty those who are oppressed, and to announce

When the Lord Jesus ascended, he promised to be with us always, baptizing us with the Holy Spirit and with fire, as on the Day of Pentecost.

On the night in which he gave himself up for us, he took bread, gave thanks to you, broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said "Take; eat; this is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

Likewise, when the supper was over, he took the cup, gave thanks to you, gave it to his disciples, and said: "Drink from this all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. As often as you drink of this, remember me.

And so, in remembrance of these, your mighty acts in Christ Jesus, we offer ourselves in praise and thanksgiving, as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ's offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

All: Christ has died; Christ is risen, Christ will come again!

One: Pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine.

Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ;

that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world,

Until Christ comes in final victory, and we feast together at his heavenly banquet. Through your son Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit in your holy Church, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever.

All: Amen.

Return to your seats via the side aisles. If you are unable to come forward, servers will bring communion to you after those coming forward have been served.


