



Facing the Holidays with a Grieving Heart



The holidays are not always a happy, enchanting, joyous time for everyone.

As the holidays approach, many who have lost a loved one may experience a wide array of emotions, including anxiety, stress, fatigue, guilt, sadness/depression, and feeling isolated. These emotions, in turn, can affect our ability to cope with the pain and to utilize resources available to us. Following are some tips for facing the holidays in a time of grief:

- Begin early to think about your holidays. This is painful because we cannot help but to think about how things will be different this year without our loved one here. But putting it off doesn't allow time for us to process our thoughts and feelings or to grieve our loss. Talk to the family early about how you will observe the holidays this year.
- Be patient with yourself. Leave the words "I should..." or "I ought to..." out of your planning process. There is no right or wrong way to handle your celebrations.
- Make your wishes known upfront. There will be many people who may think they know what's best for you and want to make plans for you. This may be helpful to some and irritating to others. Pay attention to what you are feeling and listen to your heart. Be honest and make your feelings known before major plans get made. If you're not sure about something, give it a try. If it's too painful, that's okay. You can always step away. On the other hand, if you find yourself having fun, this does not mean you don't care about the loved one who has died. It's okay to go on with living.
- Recognize that family get-togethers and certain traditions may be difficult. Keep the memory of your loved one alive. Share stories and memories together. Spend time with people you find supportive and comforting.
- Remember that everyone grieves in their own way. What is right for you may not be right for someone else, and vice versa. Allow one another the freedom to feel whatever each is feeling, and to do what each needs to cope with the grief.
- Be prepared for the fact that well-meaning people who don't know your situation will wish you 'Happy Holidays!' or 'Merry Christmas!' All the standard décor of the season will be around you in stores and restaurants. There is no escaping the trappings of the season, so pace yourself when you're out and about during the holiday season.
- Don't be afraid to ask for help. Seek out professional services if you feel you need it.
- Keep in mind that the anticipation of the holiday is often worse than the holiday itself.
- Take care of yourself. Remember that grieving is both emotional work and physical work. Get plenty of rest, eat right, exercise, take a hot bath—do whatever you need to do to care for yourself. And allow the tears to come. This is a very normal expression of grief and can help with the healing.

Capital Campaign and Stewardship Campaign Announcement Sunday

This fall, we embarked on a campaign, not only to meet our budget for 2025, but to fund our vision for our future – to love our WHOLE city and love our city whole. We will explore various avenues for living out this mission moving forward, but one certain way is to refurbish valuable ministry space in the former education wing (now being called the Vision Wing) with an HVAC system to address the moisture issues there, updated flooring and painting, and an updated security system. This will allow us to partner with others doing good and important work towards wholeness in our community.

The total cost of the capital improvement project is \$350,000, to be raised by conducting a 3-year campaign (2025, 2026, 2027) for \$250,000 and augmenting that with \$100,000 from our investments. Additionally, we need to continue to fund our annual budget (approx. \$300,000), which pays for our staff, utilities, and program.

I am thrilled to announce that we have succeeded and surpassed our goals for the capital campaign, with 97 pledges totaling \$336,202. This means we will not have to dip into our investments nearly to the extent we had planned, which puts us in a great position to fund future ministry as opportunities arise. We've also received thus far 97 pledges totaling \$283,785 towards our general budget. Although this is slightly below our hopes, experience has shown that gifts often come in during the final weeks, and we expect to meet our goals to fully fund ministry for 2025. These gifts represent more pledges and more income than in the previous 5 years, and I am truly grateful for your sacrifices, but also hopeful and excited for what God will do through us in the coming years.
