As the Christ candle shines forth at the center or our wreath and our lives, we remember how he told us: "Lo, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Glory to God!

All: Gracious God, your spirit has led us through this Advent journey. Thank you for opening our eyes to see more of your presence in our world and our lives. We rejoice in your ultimate gift of sending a Savior, who taught us the fullness of what hope, love, joy, and peace are all about. O Come, let us adore Him, Christ our Lord! Amen.


